Regulations tightened for identity verification of exporters, importers & CHAs

07.04.21 Government has notified verification regulations named Customs (Verification of Identity and Compliance) Regulations, 2021, for new importers, exporters, and customs brokers. The Customs (Verification of Identity and Compliance) Regulations, 2021, gives customs authorities power to undertake identity verification of existing importers, exporters, and customs brokers.

Turkey looking at a Strong economic partnership with India

10.04.21 Turkey is considering a Major trade and economic partnership with India in times of pandemic by focusing on virtual trade delegation programs to maintain engagement with India. Turkish Exporters Assembly (TIM) apex body of exporters conducted a virtual business mission with India to reduce the effects of COVID-19 on exports. TIM Chairman Ismail Güle said that the Turkey-India Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA) was put into the Agenda in the early 2010s, and initiatives started with the Joint Working Group. Finalizing and implementing the CEPA will have a Strong impact on bilateral trade relations.

DGFT Trade Facilitation App to create trade opportunities for MSMEs

13.04.21 The newly launched DGFT Trade Facilitation Mobile App will create international trade opportunities for Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) and foreign players, said Commerce & Industry Minister Piyush Goyal.

Trade facilitation App is ready for Industry 4.0, as it provides: Real-time trade policy updates, notifications, application status alert, tracking help requests; Explore item-wise Export-Import policy & statistics, Track IEC Portfolio; AI-based round the clock assistance for trade queries; DGFT services made accessible to all your Trade Dashboard accessible anytime & anywhere.

India-Croatia relations deepening in trade, technology, and tourism: Indian Ambassador

15.04.21 Ambassador of India to the Republic of Croatia, Raj Kumar Srivastava has said that even though Croatia is a European Union (EU) country, it is yet to be a Eurozone economy. This transition period of the next two to three years will provide an opportunity for India to utilize Croatia as a gateway towards Europe. Croatia boasts of a very strong maritime economy and there is vast land available that is yet to be harnessed by the European economy. There are opportunities to be harnessed because of the New India and New Croatia narrative that is beginning to take shape.

H.E. Mr. Petar Ljubičić, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Croatia to India said, "Our bilateral visits at the highest levels are becoming more frequent and that is the need of the hour." He drew attention to the shared diplomatic relations of 30 years between both the nations and spoke about the upcoming EU-India Summit and its negotiations on trade and investment agreement between EU and India.

Govt launches Startup India Seed Fund Scheme

20.04.21 Union Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal have formally launched the Startup India Seed Fund Scheme (SISFS) to financially support early-stage startups across 300 incubation centers.

According to the commerce ministry, the fund is expected to benefit around 3,600 startups and boost the startup ecosystem, particularly in tier-2 and 3 cities. The fund aims to provide financial assistance to startups for proof of concept, prototype development, product trials, and market entry. A sum of Rs 945 crore has been allocated for the fund.

DGFT operationalization 'COVID-19 Helpdesk' for Int'l trade-related issues

26.04.21 In view of the surge of COVID-19 cases, the Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) has operationalized a COVID-19 help desk to monitor the status of exports and imports, and difficulties being faced by trade stakeholders.

"This 'COVID-19 Helpdesk' would look into issues relating to Department of Commerce/DGFT, import and export licensing issues, customs clearance delays and complexities arising thereon, import/export documentation issues, banking matters etc.," the Ministry of Commerce and Industry said on Monday.

Govt approves agreement between India and UK on cooperation & assistance in custom matters

28.04.21 The Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi gave its approval for the signing and ratification of an agreement between the Government of India and the Government of the United Kingdom on Customs Cooperation and Mutual Administrative Assistance in Customs Matters. The Agreement will help in the availability of relevant information for the prevention and investigation of Customs offenses. The Agreement is also expected to facilitate trade and ensure efficient clearance of goods traded between the countries.

The Agreement also would provide a legal framework for sharing of information and intelligence between the Customs authorities of the two countries and help in the proper application of Customs laws, prevention and investigation of Customs offenses, and the facilitation of legitimate trade.

Govt issues guidelines for PLI scheme for the Food Processing Industry

04.05.21 The government has issued guidelines for the 'Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme for the Food Processing Industry (PLISFPI) and also launched an online portal for the PLISFPI. As part of the Prime Minister's announcement of Aatmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan, the Government has approved a new Central Sector Scheme namely PLISFPI for implementation during 2021-22 to 2026-27 with an outlay of Rs 10,900 crore.

ICAI Partnering MSMEs to Bolster them on Global Map

26.06.21 ICAI is responsive to the emerging challenges faced by the MSMEs & Startups. To address the issues faced by MSMEs & Startups, the ICAI will be taking several initiatives to strengthen and develop their capacity to enhance their competence and improve their visibility amongst the business community. The Institute will develop and provide Capacity Building Measures for the enhancement of the portfolio of MSMEs & startups.

India & Fiji to deepen cooperation in agriculture & allied sectors

23.06.21 India and Fiji signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for cooperation in the field of Agriculture and allied sectors on Tuesday. The MoU provides for cooperation in the fields of Dairy Industry Development, Rice Industry Development, Root crop diversification, Water Resources Management, Coconut Industry Development, Food Processing Industry Development, Agriculture Mechanization, Horticulture Industry Development, Agricultural Research, Animal Husbandry, Pest and Disease, Cultivation, Value Addition, and Marketing, Post-Harvest and Milling, Breeding and Agronomy.

India-Mauritius Comprehensive Economic Cooperation and Partnership Agreement

01.04.21

India and Mauritius signed the Comprehensive Economic Cooperation and Partnership Agreement (CECPA) on 22 February 2021. The CECPA is the first trade agreement signed by India with a country in Africa. Both sides have completed their internal legal procedures and the India-Mauritius CECPA will enter into force on Thursday, 01 April 2021.

The Agreement is a limited agreement, which will cover Trade in Goods, Rules of Origin, Trade in Services, Technical Barriers to Trade (TBT), Sanitary and Phytosanitary (SPS) measures, Dispute Settlement, Movement of Natural Persons, Telecom, Financial Services, Customs Procedures and Cooperation in other Areas.

The India-Mauritius CECPA provides for an institutional mechanism to encourage and improve trade between the two countries. The CECPA between India and Mauritius covers 310 export items for India, including foodstuff and beverages (80 lines), agricultural products (25 lines), textile and textile articles (27 lines), base metals and articles thereof (32 lines), electricals, and electronic item (13 lines), plastics and chemicals (20 lines), wood and articles and others. Mauritius will benefit from preferential market access into India for its 615 products, including frozen fish, specialty sugar, biscuits, fresh fruits, juices, mineral water, beer, alcoholic drinks, soaps, bags, medical and surgical equipment, and apparel.

As regards trade in services, Indian service providers will have access to around 115 subsectors from the 11 broad service sectors such as professional services, computer-related services, research & development, other business services, telecommunication, construction, distribution, education, environmental, financial, tourism & travel-related, recreational, yoga, audio-visual services, and transport services.

India-EU Connectivity Partnership

08.05. 2021

Affirming the shared values of democracy, freedom, rule of law, and respect for human rights that underpin their Strategic Partnership and recalling the 15th India-EU Summit, where leaders agreed to promote jointly a transparent, viable, inclusive, sustainable, comprehensive, and rules-based approach to connectivity, India and the EU agree to build a sustainable and comprehensive Connectivity Partnership.

Both will pursue implementation of international goals, obligations, and commitments such as the Paris Agreement, the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, the Addis Ababa Action Agenda, statements of the Asia-Europe Meeting of October 2018, the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction, the United Nations Convention on Biological Diversity, International Labour Organization Conventions and the Call for Action: Raising Ambition for Climate Adaptation and Resilience.

The Partnership will support sustainable digital, transport, energy networks, and the flow of people, goods, services, data, and capital centered on equity and inclusivity for the benefit of both India and the EU and assisting in global development efforts, based on Sustainable Development Goal principles that no one is left behind.



India and Britain may strike an interim agreement 02.06.21

India and the UK are closing in on a free trade pact, in preparation for which they might strike an interim deal. The interim trade deal would be a precursor to the UK's Enhanced Trade Partnership (ETP), which envisages facilitating market access in specific sectors.

The ETP is part of Britain's plan to enhance trade relations with global economies, following Brexit — its exit from the European Union (EU). Under a potential bilateral deal with India, Britain will open up its fisheries sector to more Indian players and offer more opportunities for nurses. It will also recognize Indian seafarers' certificates and consider a social security agreement.

An interim pact, expected to be signed by the end of this year, would open up the Indian market to British firms in the sectors of medical devices and agricultural products (such as apples, quinces, and pears), said a Bloomberg report.

If the ETP is signed, it will mark India's first major free trade agreement (FTA) in a decade.

Canada and India Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement 04.06.21

Canada and India completed their ninth round of negotiations towards a Canada-India Comprehensive Free Trade Agreement. Negotiations centered on a broad range of trade in goods and services issues and since completion, both sides have expressed a commitment to advancing the talks so a final agreement can be reached. CEPA would cover trade in goods, trade in services, rules of origin, sanitary and phytosanitary measures, technical barriers to trade, and other areas of economic cooperation.

India and Australia in talks to revive negotiations for a free trade agreement 07.06.21

In a sign of further deepening of the strong bilateral ties, India and Australia could soon resume the parleys regarding a free trade agreement. The official-level discussions are presently on between the two countries to resume talks on the Comprehensive Economic Cooperation Agreement (CECA).

This gains significance as the talks on CECA has been suspended since 2015 due to disagreement over issues like market access in agriculture and dairy products for Australia in India.

India considers reviving FTA talks with Gulf Cooperation Council 10.06.21

India is reconsidering a free trade agreement (FTA) with the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) after the United Arab Emirates (UAE), the country's biggest trading member in the bloc, approached it to revive talks that got stalled in 2008. Early analysis has identified about 1,100 products, including washing machines, ACs, refrigerators, spices, tobacco, cotton fabrics, textiles, and leather that can see higher exports through the pact. As per the official, India is keen to increase its exports to the UAE, the country's largest market in the GCC. The other countries in the group are Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, and Bahrain.

A Framework Agreement on Economic Cooperation between India and the GCC was signed in 2004 that provided for both the parties to consider ways and means to extend and liberalize trade relations besides initiating discussions on the feasibility of an FTA. Two rounds of negotiations were held - in 2006 and 2008. India stands to gain in services as well and could push for long-term business visas with the UAE, experts said.



India-African continental free trade area launched on the India-Africa trade Council Platform

18.06.21

The AfCFTA (African Continental Free Trade Area) was launched in New Delhi at the Ghana Embassy with a lot of active commitment from Indian companies to enter Africa and take advantage of the AfCFTA. AfCFTA is the biggest free trade agreement in the World since the World Trade Organization was created in the 1990s. When implemented, the AfCFTA is on a mission to increase intra-African trade by 52.3 percent. Indian trade will help all the African countries who have embraced the notion of "regionalism" and "regional integration" as part of their broader aspirations towards continental integration with this Agreement. The AfCFTA aims to expand intra-African trade through better harmonization and coordination of trade liberalization and facilitation regimes and instruments across subregions (RECs) and at the continental level.

Powering MSMEs for the economic growth of India

The significance of the MSMEs sector can be noted from the fact that it is the second-largest employment provider, after agriculture in India. At present, there are nearly 56 million such enterprises in various industries, employing close to 124 million people.

Of these, nearly 14% are women-led enterprises, and close to 60% are based in rural areas. In all, the MSME sector accounts for 8% of India's GDP and 45% of merchandise exports. Due to this, the MSME sector is called the growth engine of the nation.

Challenges of MSMEs

Lack of Adequate and Timely Access to Finance

Access to finance continues to remain the biggest challenge for MSMEs and has constrained their growth. Due to this, MSMEs are not able to invest in manufacturing, purchase raw materials on time, access new technologies, or acquire new skills due to lack of funds which is a big handicap especially in its fight with global competitors.

Technological Disruption

India's MSME sector is based on obsolete technology, which hampers its production efficiency. With the emergence of new technologies like Artificial Intelligence, Data Analytics, Robotics, and related technologies (collectively called Industry Revolution 4.0) is a bigger challenge for MSMEs than for organized large-scale manufacturing.

Regulatory Policy

MSMEs require a lot of government services and approvals, for which the entrepreneur has to run around various government departments. Getting construction permits, enforcing contracts, paying taxes, starting a business, and trading across borders continue to constrain doing business. Regulatory risks and policy uncertainty in the past have dented investor confidence.

Problem of Scale

The majority of the firms in MSMEs are micro-enterprises. The MSME space is virtually a micro space formed by a plethora of small and local shops and hence, scaling them up is a problem, especially when fund access is challenging.

Steps to Be Taken

Increasing Domestic Manufacturing Capabilities: The government can play a crucial role in creating domestic manufacturing capabilities by leveraging proposed public procurement and projects. For example, Mega public projects such as Sagarmala, Bharatmala, industrial corridors, and the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY) can stimulate domestic manufacturing activities. This should be accompanied by a simplification of the regulatory process.

Cluster Manufacturing: Efforts should be made to develop self-sufficient clusters of manufacturing competence, with Cluster Administrative Authorities, empowered to provide single window clearances to entrepreneurs and investors.

Leveraging Industrial Revolution 4.0: Disruptive technology, while leading to job losses in traditional areas, also presents new job opportunities. A greater connection between government-industry-academia is required to identify the changing requirements in manufacturing and prepare an employable workforce. Also, the Industrial Revolution 4.0 will boost the Industrial supply chains in India.

Need to improve Ease of doing business: Reforms are needed in regard, especially in the field of land, labor reforms, and in enforcing contracts.

Making Indian Products to Match Global Standards: There is a need for harmonizing Indian quality standards with global standards in many sectors. Lack of harmonization has affected Indian exports and prevented the leveraging of trade agreements adequately. There is a need to promote ZED manufacturing (Zero effect- Zero Defect) as envisaged by Make in India.

Conclusion : Collateral-free assistance or sovereign credit guarantees to the Micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) will ease the financial crunch. The government should devise this scheme in such a way that the MSME sector will be benefited.




