ADVANCE AUTHORIZATION SCHEME IN INDIA: CHANGES MADE TO EASE COMPLIANCE

BURDEN ON EXPORTERS

India is simplifying its advance authorization scheme process for expedite the exporters seeking duty-free imports of input materials that are used for final export goods. Exporters can access sector-specific norms effortlessly encounter and lesser bureaucratic hurdles. which will facilitate faster processing. In a bid to bolster the country's exports and ease the process for exporters, the Indian government has recently introduced simplified norms for availing benefits under the advance authorization scheme. This scheme permits duty-free imports of input materials for

exporters. The Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT), which implements this scheme, has now taken steps to make the norm fixation process more efficient.

Under the advance authorization scheme, the eligibility of inputs is determined by sector-specific norms committees. These committees utilize input-output norms as the basis for evaluating the eligibility of inputs. By aligning with industry-specific requirements, the scheme ensures that exporters have access to the necessary inputs without unnecessary burdens or delays.

<u>User-friendly norms database</u>

To streamline the norm fixation process, the DGFT has created a user-friendly and searchable database of ad-hoc norms that were fixed in previous years. These norms can be used by any exporter without requiring a norms committee review, as outlined in the Foreign Trade Policy (FTP) 2023.

The 'No-Norm Repeat' approach as referenced above allows exporters to secure advance authorization without the requirement of committee revisitation, leading to expedited and streamlined processing. This trade facilitation innovation is anticipated to yield quicker processing times for exporters, enhance the business environment's user-friendliness, and mitigate administrative complexities.



Gujarat Minister for MSMEs, Cottage, Khadi and Rural Industries Balwantsinh Raiput said: "One of our key priorities has been to boost exports from Gujarat and through this partnership with Amazon, we aim to empower lakhs of MSMEs in Gujarat to embrace e-commerce exports.

The Cottage and Rural Industries Department will identify about 1,000 artisans in handloom and handicrafts through its Hastkala Setu Yojana programme.

THAILAND SAYS ITS RICE EXPORTS BENEFITING FROM INDIA'S EXPORT BAN, NO PLAN TO HALT SHIPMENTS

According to an official, Thailand—world's second-largest rice exporter after India—is expected to export over 8 million metric tons of rice this year, up from 7.71 million last year. Thailand is benefiting from India's rice export ban and has no reason to halt shipments of the grain itself, its commerce minister said on Monday. The government would ensure sufficient rice output for both domestic consumption and exports, and also make sure domestic prices are not too high, minister Jurin Laksanawisit told a press briefing. In the first seven months, Thailand shipped 4.8 million metric tons, he said, adding monthly exports stood at 700,000 to 800,000 metric tons. Thailand, the world's second-largest rice exporter after India, is expected to export more than 8 million metric tons of rice this year, said Charoen Laothamatas, president of Thai Rice Exporters Association, up from 7.71 million last



Two trade sources said last week that some rice exporters in Thailand and Vietnam were renegotiating prices on sales contracts for around half a million metric tons for August shipment, after India shocked global markets with a ban on exports of non-basmati white rice.

India, the world's largest rice exporter, has banned shipments of broken rice — a move that will reverberate across Asia, according to Nomura.

In a bid to control domestic prices, the government banned exports of broken rice and slapped a 20% export tax on several varieties of rice starting Sept. 9.

Nomura said the impact on Asia will be uneven, and the Philippines and Indonesia will be most vulnerable to the ban.

India accounts for approximately 40% of global rice shipments, exporting to more than 150 countries.

Advance authorization is a permit that allows businesses to import inputs duty-free, that will be used in the production of export goods, taking into account normal wastage. Items eligible for duty-free import under this scheme include: Inputs that are physically integrated into the final exported product, accounting for regular wastage. Fuel, oil, and catalysts that are used during the production process to create the export item.

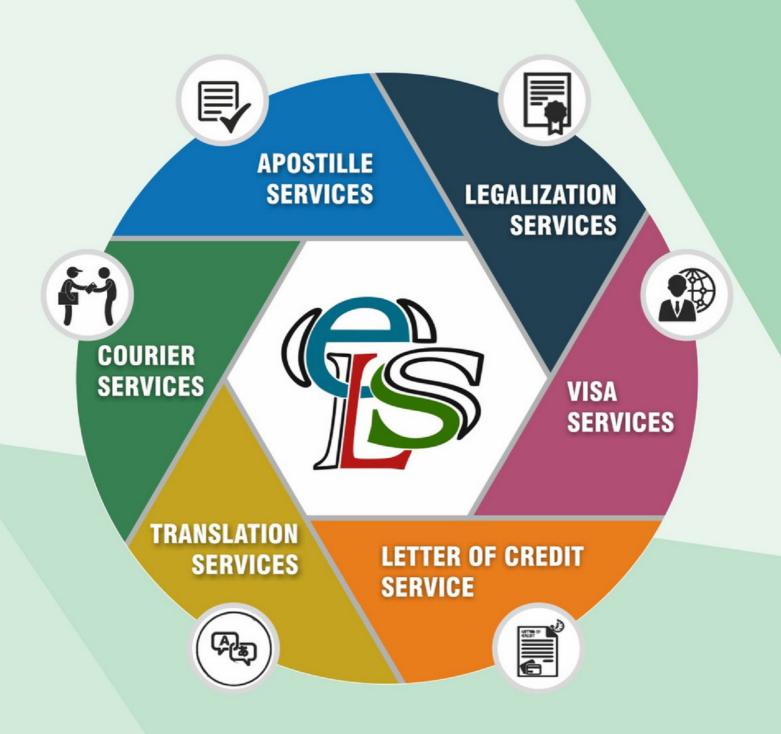
