

INDIA TO EXPORT 18 MT OF RICE IN 2024-25: USDA

India will continue to be a dominant force in the global rice trade, exporting around 18 million tonnes of rice in 2024-25, an increase of nearly 2 million tonnes from the previous year, according to projections released by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). The USDA forecasts that India's rice shipments will still fall short of the record 22 million tonnes exported in 2021-22 before the country imposed certain export curbs.



India's rice exports are projected to hold a significant portion of global trade, reaching 53.8 million tonnes in 2024-25. The USDA expects record global rice production of 527.6 million tonnes, with consumption also hitting a high of 526.4 million tonnes.

Despite production and consumption increases in various countries, global trade is expected to rise marginally due to India's export policies posing a challenge.

SUBJECT: IMPOSITION OF PORT RESTRICTIONS ON SUPPLY OF PROHIBITED/RESTRICTED ESSENTIAL COMMODITIES TO THE REPUBLIC OF MALDIVES DURING 2024-25.

S.O.(E): In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 3 read with Section 5 of the Foreign Trade (Development & Regulation) Act, 1992 (No. 22 of 1992), as amended, read with paragraph 1.02 and 2.01 of the Foreign Trade Policy (FTP), 2023, the Central Government hereby incorporates following conditions in Notification No. 03/2023 dated 05.04.2024 for exporting of essential commodities to Maldives under bilateral trade agreement between Government of India and Government of Maldives: –

Export of essential commodities under Prohibited/restricted category to the Republic of Maldives during 2024-25 shall be permitted only through the following 4 Customs Stations:-

i. Mundra Sea Port ii. Tuticorin Sea Port Nhava Sheva Sea Port (JNPT) iv. ICD Tughlakabad

3. Effect of this notification:

Imposition of Port restrictions for exporting of essential commodities under Prohibited/restricted category to the Republic of Maldives during 2024-25, as per the quota notified under DGFT Notification No. 03/2023 dt. 05.04.2023, has been notified.



INDIA'S DIESEL EXPORTS TO EUROPE PLUNGE 20% AS US, GULF RIVALS SQUEEZE MARGINS

India's diesel exports to the European continent experienced a substantial 20 per cent sequential decrease in April, falling to 2,10,000 barrels per day (bpd) from 2,62,000 bpd in March, according to data from energy cargo tracker Vortexa.

This decline can be attributed to heightened competition from suppliers in the United States and Gulf regions, compounded by waning demand within Europe, which collectively weakened profit margins on the fuel.






India's diesel exports to Europe decreased by 9% in April, despite over 40% of total shipments going to Europe. Increased exports to Asia contrast with limited European exports due to factors such as strong Middle East and US exports. Refinery maintenance in Northeast Asia presents opportunities for Indian refiners to redirect exports. They face challenges like rerouting via the Cape of Good Hope to avoid risks in the Red Sea. Europe seeking alternatives to Russian diesel benefits Indian refiners, although declining prices have impacted export revenues. Key exporters include Reliance Industries and Nayara Energy backed by Rosneft.
